



RedeCan has been asked to respond to a report that RedeCan product may contain bugs. There are pictures that appear to show “holes” that the insects are alleged to have burrowed.

RedeCan uses biologics, or beneficial insects, as part of an integrated pest management (IPM) program to naturally prevent pest insect pressures. “Bios” such as ladybugs are released into the crops throughout the growth cycle as a preventative measure to minimize any potential pest pressures and eliminate the need to use pesticides. During the late stage flower process, bios are not released because the buds are sticky at this time. Stopping the release avoids causing problems with bios sticking to the product. None of the bios released in the crop will burrow into any part of the plant. Health Canada regulations state that all approved cannabis product may contain up to 2% of foreign matters, including biologics.

RedeCan utilizes an organic approach to growing cannabis. We do not use pesticides. The “black specks” consumers may notice are harmless non-volatile organic matter important to this style of growing. They are safe for consumption and will not affect the taste, consistency, quality or effects of the cannabis. They are in no way a health concern.
